The completed evaluations for the first practice problem should be available by the beginning of next week. The second practice problem allows your students to complete a full booklet in two hours. For the younger students, this can be quite a daunting task as they have to work effectively and efficiently for two solid hours. Teaching them how to utilize their time well is an essential aspect of the whole problem-solving process and having students practice each step in a limited amount of time will be extremely valuable to them when faced with a complete booklet write.

The second practice problem, urbanization, will be due on December 8. The two videos included with this newsletter should give your students an overall understanding of the variety of issues that urban area leaders face as population increases and more people in the world move into cities.

If you have students competing in scenario writing or performance, now is a good time to get them started so they are not rushing to complete their submissions at the last moment. Please note that the CmPS Project Proposal is due to me on November 19.

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## CMPS ELEMENTS FOR PROJECT COMPLETION

#### **Project Elements**

There are three elements for project completion. Each element builds on or supplements the previous element. All three elements are required for the International Conference. Note: although certain supporting materials are not required for our State Bowl, they will be required for IC if the project qualifies for IC.

#### **CmPS Project Elements**

- Project Proposal
- ➤ Project Report
- Supporting Materials
  - ✓ Portfolio
  - ✓ Promotional Video (not required for State Bowl)
  - ✓ Display
  - ✓ Interview (not required for State Bowl)

Due to the Affiliate Director John Buissink on November 17 is the Project Proposal worth 200 points.

The project Proposal is a planning document that captures the team's original analysis of the chosen topic and community, along with the students' anticipated actions. The goal of the proposal is to capture the problem solving process at the inception of the project. It serves as a framework for the project. The Proposal allows students to:

- outline the project vision;
- define goals;
- specify deadlines;
- develop a plan for the project work; and
- demonstrate the application of problem-solving.

As the project progresses, it is natural for the project to evolve and for students to repeat steps of the problem-solving process. The Proposal sets students up for success by having them develop a plan before taking action. It is important for evaluators to see this snapshot as it allows for greater understanding of the students' application of the problem-solving process.

There is no need for the Proposal to be re-written or modified once it is created. (The actions, adaptations, adjustments, and evolution of the project are captured in the Project Report and Supporting Materials.)

The Project Proposal is one document, written before taking action with a maximum of 2,000 words.

The Project Report is one document, written during/after taking action. Max of 3500 words. Other than including the UP, only aspects of the Proposal that have been revised should be specifically included. This document is due to Affiliate Director John Buissink on **February 16.** For more information about the requirements of this document, review the information on WAFPS website <u>here</u>.
