Hello,

The first topic this year, tourism, may focus on any one of a number of sub-topics and so a broad spectrum of knowledge about different types of tourism could offer your students a definite advantage when reading the future scene. For those of you who are coaching for the first time, when writing the first practice problem your students only need to complete steps one through three.

If you haven't already looked at the new GIPS score sheet, I would recommend doing so. The possible scores in each step have increased and the category list now contains 21 separate categories. A team now can receive credit for two miscellaneous challenges or solutions if the evaluator thinks that they both deserve to be classified as miscellaneous.

Check out the World Solutions Challenge. For students who know little about the six-step problem solving process, this will give them an opportunity to learn and practice it. For more knowledgeable students, the six-step process can be used to develop an action plan. Only the action plan will be used to determine the challenge winners. Registration for this competition closes on September 12.

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#### ZOOM MEETINGS FOR COACHES


